Call to Order by Supervisor Blouvet.

**Motion to approve** the minutes from April 19, 2017, offered by Russell Hall seconded by Donette Shelley. All approve.

# SUPERVISOR'S CONCERNS

Supervisor Blouvet voiced that he is not happy with the Town's accounting firm, and it seems the Hwy Superintendent, Mike Bidwell and working Supervisor Oakley Sortore for public works also feel the same way. They feel they never know what is left in their working budget. The Supervisor is presently looking into another accounting firm. This firm said they would come and talk to the Board regarding their firm and accounting options.

Supervisor wants the Police Dept. to look into Police Grants; he states there are some out there.

Supervisor Blouvet spoke regarding the garbage rates, he stated Cuba wants to save money, but he feels they need to pay more. We are losing money on refuse pickup, something has to be done. People have been dumping trash off the side of the road, also people are bringing trash from outside of the district into the district for pickup. He proposes that the Town offers a \$50.00 reward leading to the arrest and conviction for dumping or bringing the trash in from outside the district. They cannot be anonymous; they will have to officially file a complaint with the Town or the Police Dept. The \$50.00 reward could be recouped through the defendant paying restitution to the Town.

After Board discussion the following Resolution was brought forth:

#### **RESOLUTION 12-2017**

**Be it hereby resolved,** that the Town will pay \$50.00 reward to the person who gives information that leads to the arrest and or conviction of the person dumping trash off the side of the road or bringing trash from outside of the refuse district into the trash district to be picked up. The person reporting incident cannot remain anonymous; they will have to officially file a complaint with the Town or the Police Dept. The \$50.00 reward could be recooped to the Town from the defendant through paying restitution to the Town. Resolution offered by James Blouvet, seconded by Carolyn Carney.

Supervisor Blouvet discussed briefly that the Town can safely allocate 30,000 gallons a day of water to Crossroads and therefore he suggested the Board agree to the Water Supply Agreement to the Allegany Crossroads Utility Corporation(the Crossroads Utility). After brief Board discussion the following Resolution was brought forth:

## RESOLUTION 13-2017 RESOLUTION FOR WATER SUPPLY AGREEMENT

WHEREAS, the Town of Friendship(the "Town") owns, operates and maintains a water system which supplies potable water to existing water districts of the Town(the "Water System");and

**WHEREAS,** the Allegany Crossroads Utility Corporation(the "Crossroads Utility") is a water transportation corporation created under the New York Transportation Corporations Law to supply water to residents, inhabitants and businesses along County Road 20 in portions of the Towns of Friendship and Amity(the "Crossroads System"); and

**WHEREAS,** the Town previously entered into an Inter-Municipal Water Agreement in 2007 with the County of Allegany(the "Inter-Municipal Agreement") to provide water and maintenance services for a contemplated County Water District No. 2, originally intended to serve the same purpose and area which is now intended to be served by the Crossroads System; and

**WHEREAS,** the Water system has adequate excess capacity to provide water to the Crossroads Utility for use in the Crossroads System; and

**WHEREAS,** the Town and the Crossroads Utility are mutually willing and desire to enter into an agreement for the Town to provide water and maintenance services to the Crossroads Utility on terms as similar as practicable to those in the Inter-Municipal Agreement.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Town Board of the Town of Friendship(the "Board") that the Board hereby approves and authorizes the town Supervisor, in consultation with the Town's engineer and with the advice and counsel of the attorney for the Town, to

negotiate(and enter into an agreement)with the Crossroads Utility for the Town to provide water and maintenance services to the Crossroads Utility on terms as similar as practicable to those in the Inter-Municipal Agreement, which will allocate 30,000 gallons per day of water to the Crossroads System, with the opportunity for additional water to be supplied as the Town's supply and demand may allow, and the Town Supervisor is hereby authorized to take such steps as may be necessary to carry out said negotiations.
